Relay for Life of Pulaski County is a volunteer driven event that gives everyone in the community a chance to celebrate the lives of people who have battled cancer, to remember loved ones lost and to fight back against the disease. Teams will walk a path in honor of their loved ones, raise funds, play games and make lasting memories and friends. A special team is registered this year to honor the memory of Waynesville Councilman, Tim Bartlett, who died in 2012.

The Relay season kicked off on January 25 at the Hampton Inn. The summer will feature a fundraising dance and two community Relay events. A Youth Relay is also being planned and the annual Relay event will return to Waynesville this year and will be held on Saturday, September 28, in the Waynesville Roubidoux Park. It will run from noon until 12:30 a.m. The community is invited to participate and make this event one of the best ever.

The American Cancer Society provided over 250 various services to Pulaski County residents in 2012. They offer help to people in times of great stress and the money raised at the Relay events make those efforts possible.

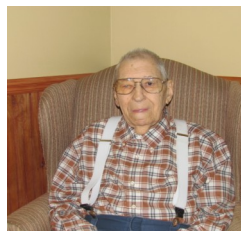

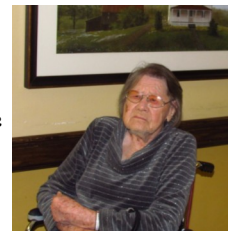
HONORING WAYNESVILLE CENTENARIANS

Waynesville's Life Care Center is home to an award winning staff. In 2012 Life Care was named one of the top nursing homes in the United States by the "U. S. News and World Report". Life Care is home to two well-known Waynesville citizens. Nelson "Pop" Morgan was born November 4, 1909, in St. Louis. He was a railroad man with the Missouri Pacific most of his adult life and served in WWII with the U. S. Army, providing logistical support at the Battle of the Bulge. "Pop" has been a Mason for over 70 years and holds many decorations and awards. He was married to Vera for nearly 50 years and is the father of Nelson Morgan, a Waynesville resident. "Pop" loves to visit with friends and family.

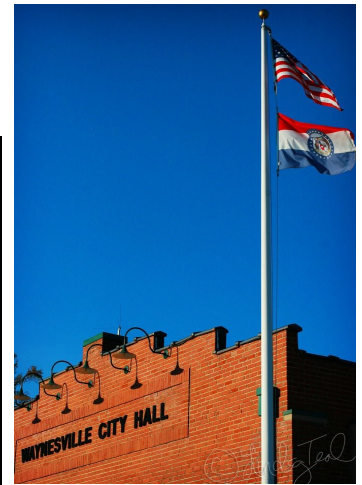
Pauline Sheeley was born August 13, 1912, one of nine children. She attended school in

 *approved a resolution to apply for a MoDOT Cost Share Grant to build three lanes from the I Bank to T Highway and to install a roundabout at the T Highway intersection
 *announced 35 mph speed limit on Ichord Ave.


2012 CITY PROJECTS
 2012 was a productive year for the City of Waynesville. Goals were set in April and the City staff has worked hard to complete a host of projects, plus day to day activities. Examples are:
 *Completed new animal shelter
 *Completed new playground and pavilion
 *New commercial building in West Waynesville and Downtown
 *Work has begun on the Waynesville Industrial Park
 *Completed Waste Water improvements
 *Purchased additional park property (Old Middle School)
 *Airport grants
 *Reduced crime and drug trafficking in the City
 *Launched new website
 *\$36 million construction
 *Continued DREAM initiative downtown, formed WDBA
 *Added \$500,000 to reserves
 *Progress on upgrading electric feeder lines

BUDGET PLANNING BEGINS
 Last year's budget for the City was \$16.2 million and the expectations are that the number will at least be steady, or increase, as the City works to fulfill several major projects in the coming year. Hard decisions must be made, as local governments MUST balance their budget throughout the year.
 Meetings began in January with the various departments, as the supervisors prioritized their goals and needs for the coming year.
 Two major goals of the City for 2013 are the completion of a culvert/bridge project at the tennis courts on Old H Highway and the paving of the second downtown parking lot.
 As development continues in the City, traffic will increase and routes to the high school and the G. W. Lane St. area must be improved.

 Joe York is the City's Natural Gas Supervisor. Joe is a native of Waynesville and has worked for the City since 2009. He was named supervisor in 2011. He is a proud, and busy, father of four, coaching baseball and basketball for over 20 years. He loves being outdoors, hunting and fishing. Joe is a member of the Idumea Baptist Church.
