## PULASKI COUNTY KIWANIS' CLUB OFFERS A HAND TO OUR YOUTH

Founded in 1979, the Pulaski County Kiwanis' Club focuses on the youth in our community. The Club is made up of men and women dedicated to service of the youth and the citizens of our community. Celebrating over 34 years of community activities, the Club sponsors the annual Project Graduation, a drug and alcohol free celebration for seniors of WHS. They have served over 5000 graduates, raising over \$225,000 in food, prizes and fun for this special night.

Other events include the Kids Fishing Derby for special needs students, offering the Bill Lillis Memorial Scholarship to WHS and one graduate from other county schools. The Club led the building of the ball fields in Roubidoux Park and began the local soccer program. They have donated countless hours to Good Samaritan and the Salvation Army. The local group also works with the Snack in the Pack program, the USO and sponsors the Gun/Knife/Archery Show in Aug.

The Kiwanis Club meets weekly at the Price Cutter Restaurant at 6:30 am, on Thursday. If you have a desire to serve, there is a place for you with the Kiwanis Club. The Club also sponsors the Key Club at WHS, as a direct connection to young people. Their mission statement says it all, "Kiwanis is a global organization of volunteers dedicated to changing the world, one child and one community at a time." 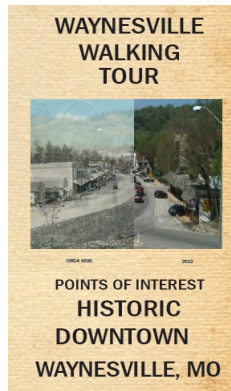
**NEW CITY WELCOME SIGN**

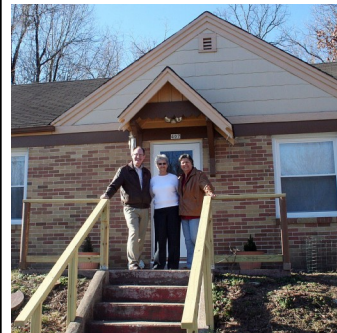


**ADOPT A SPOT BEGINS**
