LONG TERM AGREEMENT REACHED WITH SEWER DISTRICT

After many contentious years of disagreement between the City and the Pulaski County Sewer District, a long term agreement concerning territory, rates and waste plant capacities was signed on March 1 at the Sewer District Offices. PCSD Chairman Gary Porter and Mayor Luge Hardman signed the mutual agreement in the presence of many of the people who worked to bring closure to these issues and local media.

Porter said, "This is an historic moment for the citizens of the County and the City." Problems began in 1991 when an area was annexed in West Waynesville and questions over service to that area led to much disagreement. Law suits followed and several years of not working together were unproductive. Hardman said to the group, "This long nightmare is over and now we can work at being partners in the many opportunities that lie ahead for our area."

The agreement was unanimously passed by the City Council at the Feb. meeting. Council-

man Mike France, chairman of the Utilities Committee, offered the agreement for passage and he and his committee were very instrumental in the final version and its passage.

UTILITY NOTES

In the spring of 2010, the City lost our electric provider, Sho-Me Electric. Since that time, we have worked hard to choose the correct replacement. The Council has approved a long term commitment to the Missouri Power Energy Pool, or MoPEP, which offered the least amount of increase and more control. Customer's electric rates, however, will increase 34%. The City has passed those increases along to our commercial customers. too, not just residential. We have planned an 8% increase for three years and then a re -evaluation of our options concerning the remaining increase. Rates for residential are \$12.75 for an availability charge and .098 per KWH.
