## FREEDOM FEST WELCOMES CROWD TO THE SQUARE

The Waynesville Downtown Business Association sponsored Freedom Fest on the Square June 15th. Early morning weather dampened the crowd response, but estimates of 1500 people visited the downtown square and celebrated Flag Day and America. Over 50 vendors offered food, crafts, information and fun for the visitors.

In the afternoon, over 100 motorcycles arrived to deliver a fund raising check and presented it to the Fort Leonard Wood USO. Representatives were on hand for the presentation. The bikes lined three sides of the downtown square and provided an exciting afternoon.

Vino Alan made a stop at the karaoke stand and entertained the crowd with three songs. The local star of the X Factor gave his interpretation of "God Bless the USA!" and the crowd approved.

The next festival will be Frogtober Fest, planned for October 5th in the Roubidoux Park and the WDBA will sponsor Oktoberfest on the Square, October 19th. The WDBA has repaired the welcome sign at Highway 17 and is painting the flower pots that line the square. The City appreciates all the volunteers who work tirelessly to showcase our City and our citizens.

**WORK AT HUNTER'S POINT**

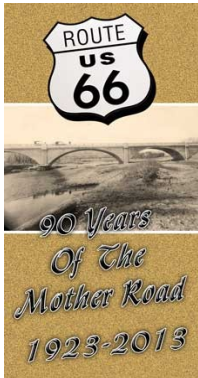
A construction project is underway to extend the water line from the Waynesville Industrial Park to the well houses of the Highway H water system.
