SUSTAINABLE OZARKS PARTNERSHIP HIGHLIGHTS FORT WOOD

The Sustainable Ozarks Partnership (SOP) is a new organization for the Waynesville/St. Robert community and our four county region. SOP is focused on saving and growing Fort Leonard Wood. This sustainability goal focuses on more jobs, better health care and improving the quality of life for our region.

The SOP region is Laclede, Phelps, Pulaski and Texas counties, their communities and Fort Leonard Wood. SOP works with Regional Sustainability Teams, or RSTs, to support the many initiatives that address such broad areas of concern as Economic Development, Education and Workforce Development, Environment and Natural Resources, Health and Wellness, Quality of Life, Transportation and Utility Infrastructure.

The RSTs are working on many regional opportunities and issues that include a new health care complex at Fort Wood, serving both military and civilian populations, acquiring new missions at Fort Wood, including non-DOD missions. Other initiatives include ways to reduce operating costs at Fort Wood through partnerships with regional com-

munities and the state of Missouri, investigating renewable, regional power generation and better roads.

Mayor Hardman and City Administrator Bruce Harrill serve on the SOP Executive Board.
