ROUBIDOUX PARK TO GET NEEDED STAGE

A goal of the Waynesville Park Board for several years has been the construction of a stage in the Roubidoux Park. This will be a wonderful addition for our festivals and events. The stage will feature a sound system, lighting and storage. It will also be available to rent for private functions, such as weddings and reunions. Working with architects, Ireland and Associates, the City has begun the designing and planning associated with this project. The Waynesville Community Foundation (WCF) is conducting the fundraising for the project and allowing the community to have a part in supporting this much needed and anticipated amenity. Donations will be tax deductible. A donation from the Dial Family estate, as well as tax money from the Parks Capital Improvement Tax, has begun the building. The structure will feature a bronze plaque listing donors and detailing the building of the project. Plans are to dedicate it on July 19th and have it open for Old Settler's Day, details will follow as construction begins.

ALL SEASONS CLUB WORKS WITH EXTENSION

The All Seasons Club began in the early 70's as a part of the University of Missouri Extension Homemaker's Association. Eight active clubs in the county formed the Pulaski County Home and Community Council. Their mission was to improve quality of life at home and in the community. The group meets monthly and works on community service projects.

As young mothers, their first projects focused on children. The Club provided the first playground equipment in the Roubidoux Park. They volunteered at the Well Baby Clinic each month and as their children grew they assisted with other age appropriate projects. Today, they work with Shop with a Cop, backpack programs, 4-H and Space Camp programs, Senior Centers and Habitat for Humanity. They supply animal shelters and health kits and clothing for the homeless. They show how vital community involvement can be.
