POLICE DEPARTMENT GETS NEW VEHICLES

This year the Police Committee is trying a new approach to replacement of our Police fleet. Instead of purchasing one car each year, as we have done in the past, the City has signed a lease/purchase for three Dodge Chargers. The agreement pays for service and car washes for the three years. After the lease period, the City can purchase the vehicles at a nominal cost. These vehicles are brand new and are turn-key ready for use, except for our lettering. Each Charger has a Watch Guard camera system. The cameras are HD wireless systems and can be integrated to include the vehicle's radar system, GPS and speedometer. Also available are dual cameras and microphones for the officer's person. The microphones and cameras serve to document an incident as it occurs and provides valuable evidence. The microphones have approximately 1-2 miles effective range by using an internal antenna.

Chief Dan Cordova says, "Our officers enjoy having the camera systems in the vehicle, as it serves to ensure that the officer's actions are recorded, and also protects the public."



YMCA MAKES A DIFFERENCE

The Armed Service YMCA has served our area since 1986. The decision to relocate to expanded space in downtown Waynesville from Fort Wood has opened up endless opportunities for the ASY to reach out to ALL youth and families, military and civilian. Since opening at 403 School Street (the County Annex) last April, the Y has increased participation in its programs by 17%. Many of the activities are low cost or free and focus on family, youth development, social responsibility and healthy living. There is no monthly membership fee.

The Y offers many programs including, Pre-school twice a week, the CARES program on literacy, basketball tournaments, Zumba classes, babysitting classes and many more. July 26 will feature the annual Duck race at Old Settler's Day and July 25 -27 the Field of Heroes will be on display in the Roubidoux Park. 


NEW CITY HALL HOURS
