**COUNCIL, CONT.**

\*reported the 2013 independent Audit prepared by KPM CPA firm, with no major findings and a "clean" audit. Impacting this audit is our changing our fiscal year to Jan. 1. Net position of the City increased by \$810,269 for the nine month period. Total liabilities decreased by \$2,039,628. The August flood impacted the City and the City budget.

## GROWTH ALLIANCE WORKS FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The Pulaski County Growth Alliance (PCGA) was formed in 2008 as a outgrowth of a volunteer economic development group sponsored by the Meramec Regional Planning Commission. In 2009 Wayne Morgan was hired as the director of the organization. His office is in the Tourism Center.

The Mission of the PCGA is to attract and retain jobs, bring new investment to the County and increase local tax revenues. Several activities and initiatives keep the group busy and focused on economic development. The PCGA established the Entrepreneur Club of Pulaski County to advise and assist new businesses. The Club meets every Tuesday at 5:30 at the Tourism Center. PCGA also leads the efforts to receive designation as a Certified Work Ready Community, which alerts employers that workers with certain skill levels are available and ready to work.

The PCGA is partnering with the City of Waynesville to build a spec building on the new Waynesville Industrial Park area along I-44. Using funds from a Community Development Block Grant, the plans are to build a 20,000 sq. ft. building that will expand to 40,000.
