**CITY COUNCIL NOTES**

- \*premiered a video produced by the WCC Video Class, inviting KY 3 to host "Celebrate the Ozarks" in Waynesville. Great job to the WHS Video class! You can view it on our Facebook page.
- \*honored Mike Dunbar, Chuck Lynn and the Lowe's Heroes Program for their volunteerism to the community
- \*accepted a \$20,000 check from the Mid MO Credit Union for the Little Heroes Playground project
- \*adopted the recommended redistricting of our city wards. Maps will be available at a later date.

**COUNCIL, CONT.**

- \*reported fund balances of \$4.3 million, with over \$560,000 in available funds
- \*adopted a balanced budget for 2015 in the amount of \$16.8 million
- \*reported FEMA approval and expected reimbursement for four flood mitigation projects: moving the baseball field, moving the Street Dept., moving the Roubidoux lift station up to North Street and replacing the shower house at the RV Park
- \*announced a surprise State inspection of the Animal Shelter with no problems noted and compliments. Great job to all!

**SUNSET WATER TOWER**

The coming year will see several important infrastructure projects for the City, including the upgrade of the Sunset Water Tower, off Route 66. It will be relined, starting in March, to correct leaks that have developed over the years.
