A NEW COUNCIL IS SWORN IN

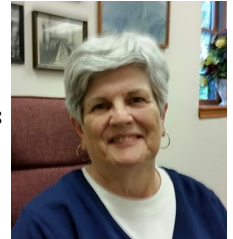

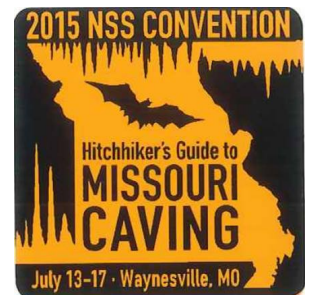

THE NATIONAL CAVERS ARE COMING TO WAYNESVILLE

Excitement is building as the City expects over 1000 cavers to visit Waynesville during the week of July 13-17. The convention will offer an action packed week of daily symposia, guided cave trips, vendors and major events each evening. Over 200 caves will be offered during #NSS2015, including the world renowned diving cave, the Roubidoux Spring. The public may participate in the many activities by registering on line @NSS2015.



Convention Central will be Waynesville High School, offering its state of the art facility. Campground accommodations are located at the Pulaski County-Fort Leonard Wood Shrine Club.

Several above ground activities have been planned, as the Tourism Bureau teams up with the Route 66 Courthouse Museum, the Old Stagecoach Stop, Crocker's Frisco Depot; as well as road tripping on Route 66, fishing in the Roubidoux trout streams, honoring those who suffered on the Trail of Tears and enjoying the Gasconade and Big Piney Rivers. *The City's Waste Water Plant was recently inspected by the Dept. of Natural Resources. We received positive information on the performance of the plant. Our plants meets, or exceeds, the current and projected water quality standards for the state of Missouri. *Water/Waste Water Superintendent Danny Graves stated, "Our plant is performing better than ever before. We are in compliance and exceeding the standards." *The recent multi-million dollar investment in our plant continues to pay dividends for the citizens and the quality of water returned to the Roubidoux Creek.

- *Continuing our update from last month, the work in Mitchell Creek continues, with permission from the Corps of Engineers and of 23 of the 71 home owners along the creek who have given permission to work along their property lines.
- *City workers have removed 320 tons of debris, gravel, fallen trees and have stabilized the bank in key areas. Workers have removed a garage that had washed downstream and lodged in a channel of the creek. *The City has performed over \$20,000 in time, equipment, labor and materials and we will continue to focus on this important issue, as we can.
