## OLD SETTLERS' DAY HIGHLIGHTS HISTORY

Civil War re-enactments and the Kickapoo Trace Muzzleloaders will highlight the 2016 Old Settlers' Day in the Roubidoux Park. Sponsored by the Pulaski County Museum and Historical Society, a much larger event is planned for this year, as they bring "History Back to Old Settlers' Day".

Civil War Reenactments both days and Living History Displays will be featured throughout the two day event, planned for July 30 and 31 in the Roubidoux Park. Activity begins Saturday morning at 8:00 am and will remain open to the public until 5:00 pm. At 7:00 pm, live music and old style dancing will be performed at the new stage area. The Civil War encampments will be open on Sunday from 8:00 am until the noon reenactment. An encampment of ladies dressed in period costumes will be at the Old Stagecoach Stop.

Live entertainment will be performing at the stage throughout the day.

The Back Porch Players, the Beyond the Circle Dancers, the Flower O Scotland Dance Troupe and Celtic Music by Connor Howley. Special guests are President Abraham Lincoln, portrayed by Lance Mack, General U. S. Grant, portrayed by Wayne Issleb and Jefferson Davis, portrayed by Donald Belles. ## COMMUNITY RECYCLING UPDATE

The communities of St. Robert and Waynesville are beginning a marketing and education grant for improving our recycling program with the St. Robert Transfer Station and Zeigenbein Sanitation.

Flyers have been dispersed in both cities and people have begun reserving recycle bins, which should arrive shortly. Please join this effort to improve our recycling, by calling Tracey at the Utility office. Three bins per household may be checked out to Waynesville Utility customers who receive trash pick-up within our City limits.

In 2014, 64 homes in Waynesville participated and 28 in St. Robert. Just that small number of homes diverted over 4 tons of trash from our land fills. Please consider taking part in this important project. It takes very little effort and just some scheduling on your part.



In Waynesville, the bi-weekly pick up is Thursday, east of Ichord Ave and Friday, west of Ichord. The first July pick up in Waynesville is July 7 and 8. If you have questions, give Tracey a call at the City Hall, 774-5217.
