USE TAX TO BE ON APRIL BALLOT AS PROP 1

Retail shopping is changing and Internet purchases are increasing. Many cities in Missouri already have a Local Use Tax in place for out of state vendors. Waynesville is asking our citizens to research and know the facts before you vote on April 3rd on this important issue. This is not a NEW Sales Tax! Our portion of Internet sales could be \$60,000 annually and we are losing that.

1. This is NOT a new tax. It is being collected already by Internet companies and by the DMV on registrations of vehicles and will continue to be collected. Amazon and other vendors collect a MO use tax. I purchased something last week from Amazon and my tax was \$9.32.
2. If we do not add this to our Municipal Tax Code, our portion will not be distributed to us from the State. Many MO cities have already passed this and are collecting the Use Tax.
3. This Use Tax will be collected no matter how you vote. We are asking you to allow the City of Waynesville to claim their portion of this money.
4. We pledge to you that any monies collected from the Use Tax will be used for Roads, Streets and Storm Water detention in the City.

CITY COUNCIL NOTES

- *honored outgoing Park Board Chairman, Jesse De Graftenreed for his dedication to improving our parks
- *highlighted and commemorated the 175th anniversary of Waynesville being designated the County Seat of Pulaski
- *passed a Mutual Aid Agreement with the City of Dixon
- *established a policy concerning the governing of reserve accounts
- *established a policy to allow hardship payments for utilities w/o penalty
- *approved an agreement for consulting services at the Regional Airport

- *reported \$3.3 million in reserve accounts
- *reappointed Janet Cridler, Scott Owens, Doug Beard and Jim Lord to the Planning and Zoning Commission
- *passed an ordinance restricting tethering of animals, relating to weather, shelter, food and length of the tethering
- *received a report on the failure of the water tower on Sunset Drive and the options to replace or repair it
- *announced the completion of our annual audit with an expected clean report

PARK GRANTS

The City and the Park Board have recently applied for grants to extend our walking trail and add paved parking along Benton Street.

With the planned construction of an accessible bathroom on the east side of the park and discussion of adding a Remote Control Track, changes are coming for the Roubidoux Park. Park Board members are always looking for ideas and champions to improve our facilities.

Cameras have been installed at the new Little Heroes Playground and new signage should arrive before spring. Things are happening on the banks of the Roubidoux!
