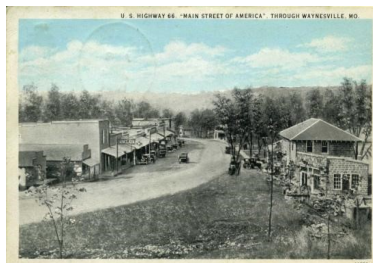
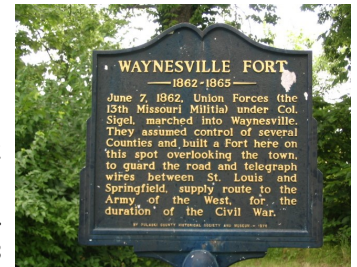

WAYNESVILLE CELEBRATES 175 YEARS AS COUNTY SEAT

At the February City Council meeting, Mayor Hardman signed a proclamation recognizing the 175th anniversary of Waynesville's designation as the county seat of Pulaski County. Also, present were representatives of the County, including Pre-siding Commissioner Gene Newkirk and County Clerk Brent Bassett.

Celebrations will take place all year commemorating this event. Plans are to commission a collector's plate honoring Waynesville and Pulaski County.

CITY COUNCIL NOTES

- *welcomed Scout Ethan Beatty, as he completed work on a Community badge
- *announced building permits have been issued for the new Kum N' Go facility on G. W. Lane Street
- *approved contract with AST Storage Tank Company to replace the water tower on Sunset Drive
- *approved changes in the airport project for a parallel taxiway
- *approved a marketing agreement with SOP, concerning the airport
- *approved two MoDOT grant applications for traffic enforcement

COUNCIL NOTES, Cont.

- *reported \$3.58 million in reserve accounts and \$1.4 million in net income for the year
- *discussed continuing mitigation work in the Mitchell Creek area, using a cost share agreement, with approval from the Corps of Engineers
- *announced a Springfield Cardinal Day at the Park, to benefit the WSR Sports Program, June 23rd
- *announced the updating of our city maps of infrastructure used in Mo One Call and Dig Rite
- *announced smoke testing for our sewer lines, in the West Waynesville area, placards are being placed on doors

CODE RED ALERTS CITIZENS!

The City of Waynesville subscribes to the CodeRed Alert system. We have used this for a year and feel that it has done the job we needed. If you have not signed up for CodeRed and you get utilities from the City of Waynesville, go to our website at www.waynesvillemo.org and on the right hand side, click on "CodeRed". Follow the prompts to enroll to receive alerts and messages from the City concerning criminal activity, Amber alerts, Homeland Security issues, weather alerts and road closings.

You may choose to have the alerts sent to land lines, cell phones, texts or emails. Be sure and provide your local address for each choice. We have used the CodeRed for local notifications during weather warnings and criminal activity in our community.
