After the April election, a write-in candidate was named to the Ward Two council seat. Donald Ungerecht was sworn in at the April Council meeting, but family issues led him to announce his resignation.

Replacing Donald, and sworn in at the May Council meeting, is Cecil Davis of the Summit area. Cecil has experience serving the City, as a member and chairman of the Planning and Zoning Commission. He is a retired combat engineer and recently joined the faculty at WHS as a biology teacher. He is married to Alanna and father to two daughters.



Michele Brown has been appointed Waynesville City Clerk, effective June 1st, following the retirement of Carol Welch. Michele brings many skills to a job dependent on organization and work ethic. She brings municipal experience to the job, after working with our police department, utilities and as Executive Assistant. Michele has a son and daughter and the joy of her life, a grandson. Michele looks forward to bringing new and creative ideas to the city, while building on the traditions already established.

WAYNESVILLE HOSTS BIG BAM

Waynesville is one of five cities along Route 66 to host the BIG BAM (Bicycles Across Missouri). June 20th will see an estimated 600 bicyclists coming into the Roubidoux Park area for a night of camping and a music festival which is open to the public. Downtown businesses and restaurants will be open for the event and shuttles will run for participants to visit St. Robert and other sites.

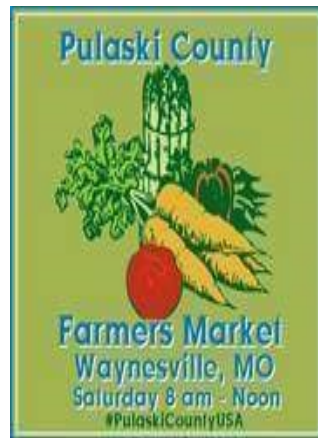
