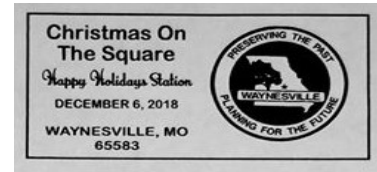

2018: YEAR IN REVIEW

Another busy year for the City. As we welcome 2019, we look back at our accomplishments of 2018. We have seen commercial growth, better accessibility and many utility infrastructure improvements. We.... *Welcomed Kum N Go and a new Taco Bell in West Waynesville. *Dedicated the Little Heroes Playground. *Completed an accessible bathroom to complement the Playground. *Purchased two water systems and are continuing to make improvements to them. *Replaced the Sunset Water Tower after its failure. *Replaced all street lights with LED. *Grew the WSR Youth Sports Program. *Annexed 197 acres on and around Bollinger Hill and extended water lines to that area. *Passed the Internet Use Tax with those monies designated for roads and storm water improvements. *Cleared electric right of ways. *Replaced fire hydrants. *Paved roads. *Using gravel from the Mitchell Creek and Dyer Street areas, we have saved thousands on other projects. *With the School, completed a detention area above Tiger Bridge to slow water from across the Interstate. *Improved adoption rates at the Animal Shelter. *Applied, and awarded, a Trail grant for improvements to the Walking Trail.

CITY COUNCIL NOTES

- *There will be NO City Council meeting in December.
- *honored Marv Luten of KFBD radio for his 40 years of service to our community
- *Postmaster Cheryl Huhman announced a special postmark for Christmas on the Square
- *offered condolences to the family of former Waynesville Mayor Bill Ransdall for his long time service
- *announced plans to engineer the Risky Road project this coming year
- *passed a 3% COLA for city employees
- *filing for office begins Dec. 11-Jan. 15

CITY COUNCIL, CONT.

- *announced \$3.03 million in reserves
- *adopted a \$20.2 budget for fiscal year 2019
- *announced the installation of sanitation stations for animals in the parks
- *The City continues to fight the unprecedented increase in natural gas transportation costs. Along with four other cities, Waynesville plans to bring a lawsuit in State court to stop the planned Dec. 1st increase of over 134%. The Council passed an ordinance to absorb some of the costs with reserve monies, until the case is determined in federal and state court.
