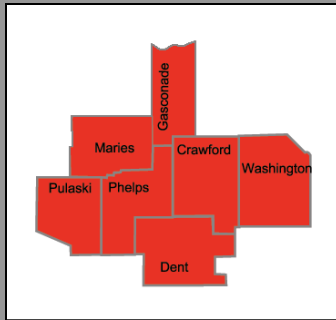

## ITEMS TO RECYCLE

|    | <p><b>ALUMINUM RECYCLING:</b> aluminum cans and clean foil</p>   |
|    | <p><b>PAPER RECYCLING:</b> White paper, colored paper, brown envelopes, manila folders, junk mail, magazines and phone books; small amounts of staples are okay. Cardboard, corrugated boxes, paperboard (shoe, cereal &amp; soda boxes), and shipping cartons</p> |
|    | <p>Plastic bottles: (soft drink, single-use water bottles, sports drinks), clean food jars, cosmetic container.</p>  |
|    | <p>Detergent bottles, milk and juice jugs</p>  |
|   | <p>Medicine bottles, plastic cups, syrup bottles</p>   |
|  | <p>Steel and tin cans</p>  |



### PAPER & CARDBOARD

- Office paper, Newspaper, Packing paper, and Magazines.
- Small quantities of paper must be put in bags or flattened out and bound with string. If you have large quantities, you will need to call the Transfer Station 573-336-5155, or Zeigenbein Sanitation (573-336-4848) for more information.

### PLASTIC

- Type 1 (PETE) and Type 2 (HDPE) opaque and colored plastic. Labels do not have to be removed. Check containers for the recycling label which is usually found on the bottom of containers.
- Type 3, 6 and 7 plastics **WILL NOT** be accepted for recycling.

### CANS

- Tin cans and aluminum cans.
