Call to Order: Mayor Wilson called the June 20th, 2024, meeting of the Waynesville City Council to order at 5:00pm.

Roll Call: On roll call, Mayor Wilson and seven (7) council members were present:

CITIZEN COMMENTS

Curtis Keetan – 1100 Hawthorn Street. Concerned about safety due to a street light that has not been repaired for over a year. Mr. Keetan also stated there is still debris from the storm that is piled up on his property on Old H Hwy that needs to be picked up as well. Mayor Wilson stated he believed the street light power had been cut while fiber optic was being installed by a different company. The City has been in contact with the company and are trying to make arrangements for the light to be fixed.

Vannie Williams – 21715 Ranch Rd. Also concerned about a street light in his area. The Council informed Mr. Williams that his light may be serviced by Laclede Electric, not the City. Mr. Williams was also upset that there continues to be dead animals all over the roadways.

Hyatt - Stated that the City offering a Jr. Internship with the Mayor was a great idea.

Rice - Thanked Chief Cordova and the Police Department for the good job they have done lately.

Hayden - If anyone still needs debris picked up, he is willing to help out. Also, if anyone has concerns about the City's finances, he would like to speak to them to understand why they believe there is a need for an audit.

Bland - AUSA event held in the park last weekend was a great event. Can't wait for next year's.

Koren - Welcome to Summer. Connect with Hyper reach to get emergency information and be mindful that school kids are out on break.

Mayor Comments – Mayor Wilson urged everyone to be alert at the crosswalk at the bridge. Few cars were stopping to let people pass. Stated that the City received an additional TAP grant that will extend sidewalks to GW Lane down Ichord Ave. And echoed Councilwoman Dils and asked people to adhere to the time restraints on fireworks.
