THE YEAR IN REVIEW: 2016

2016 was another very busy year for the city. The year ended with the move into the new Municipal Center and the completion of the Dyer Street Bridge. Several other flood mitigation projects were completed, including the Farmer's Market pavilion, at the location of the old Street Department in the RV Park, installation of a gravel trap at the head of Mitchell Creek and the beginning of plans for a detention area above Tiger Pride Bridge.

The Municipal Center was completed and an Open House is planned for January 19, 4-6 pm. The Public Works Construction Department and other departments did an excellent job of renovating the old Cinema building and saving hundreds of thousands of dollars for the citizens. The Police Department will move into the old City Hall during the new year.

With our partners the city installed a 3.2 megawatt solar farm to add green energy to our electric grid. We have worked to improve our electric feeder lines and we replaced many electric poles throughout the city.

Work continues on the traffic circle at T Highway, the accessible playground and the Speculative Building at the Industrial Park. These projects will be completed in the new year.

Master Planning at the Airport and a Capital Improvement Plan for our streets were completed.

As the community continues the fundraising for the Little Heroes Playground, a large donation was received the week of Thanksgiving from the Brad and Arita Bohannan family from New Orleans. The Bohannan's are both graduates of WHS and have remained interested in community affairs over the years. Their philanthropic spirit was on display, as they donated \$50,000 to the Little Heroes Playground project.
