## DEDICATION OF A NEW MUNICIPAL CENTER IN WAYNESVILLE

After ten years in the Route 66 City Hall, it was very apparent that the City needed a bigger Municipal building and after some good work by our staff and sub-contractors, we have renovated the old Cinema building into a modern, attractive government center. The new Municipal Center now houses the Street Department, the Natural Gas Department, the Building Department, our Utility offices and Administrative Staff.

The building contains 20,000 sq. ft. and sits on 4.1 acres of property, which allows the City to grow in that location.

After an initial architectural estimate of nearly \$3 million for a renovation and remodeling, the City staff took on this job and we will have completed the project for around \$350,000, including furniture. Needless to say, this was a huge savings for the citizens and some great work by our staff.

An Open House for the new facility was held on January 19, prior to the monthly City Council meeting.



## HONORING THE MUNICIPAL CENTER'S HISTORY

A poster display welcomes you into the Council Chambers at the new Municipal Center and highlights the cinematic history of the new home of Waynesville's city government. The January Open House honored the connection with popcorn and soda being served and a Red Carpet entrance to the new facility.

B & B Cinema opened for business in this building in 1990 and was an active movie theatre until 2014. With interest in a new facility, the City approached the Bagby family with the idea of trading land on G. W. Lane Street. This spurred the building of the new theatre and offered a new location for city government. The wall display reads, "These poster displays honor the heritage and history of the B and B Theatre and pays tribute to the countless memories enjoyed by the good citizens of Waynesville."

- \*The City recognized employees who worked diligently on the Municipal Center project, saving the City tens of thousands of dollars.


**CITY COUNCIL NOTES**

**POLICE ARE MOVING**

The Waynesville Police Department is moving to the old City Hall location at 601 City Route 66.

Chief Cordova and his officers should be open for business by early February. City Staff have been renovating the building and installing several new security features to the facility to make it a working police station. They have added an arrest and booking area and are adding a secured room for evidence. Our Police force is proud to be in their new location with room to grow.
