CITY TO COMPLETE TWO MAJOR PROJECTS



July saw the beginning of two major projects for the City of Waynesville. The rehabilitation of G. W. Lane Street, which fronts the High School, has been in planning for several years. Work this year will include improved drainage, repair and re-paving of the existing roadway. In 2018, a third lane will be added and sidewalks built

on the north side of the roadway. The Little Heroes Playground was stalled by the flooding in May. After a successful two year fundraising campaign, the playground is on track to be completed in the August timeframe. The community is to be applauded for their response to this wonderful addition for our children. Thank you for the many activities and donations that made this possible.



REMEMBER THE REMOVAL RETURNS TO WAYNESVILLE

The Cherokee Riders returned to Waynesville in June to honor the Trail of Tears and their ancestors. This is the sixth visit by the young people as they travel from Georgia to Talhequah, OK, reenacting the 940 mile trek of tribal members in 1837 and 1839.



Waynesville is a certified stop on the National Historic Trail, sponsored by the National Park Service.



Laughlin Park served as an encampment site during the infamous removal of American Indians from the East coast, ordered by President Andrew Jackson. State Representative Steve Lynch, Missouri Trail of Tears President Deloris Wood and Mayor Hardman welcomed the Riders.


