## EVERYDAY HEROES OF WAYNESVILLE

The term "heroes" can take on special meanings when thinking of everyday jobs that affect us all. Not many people think about what happens when you flush the toilet or when you put the trash out; but some very special people take care of those needs and make sure that we are safe and clean. Some would say their job is a "dirty job", but they are necessities in any community. Zeigenbein Sanitation takes care of our trash and solid waste. They handle 45 tons of waste DAILY. A long time local family, the Zeigenbein's have filled that role since 1959. During the 2013 flood, the Zeigenbein family rose to the needs of the community and offered a quick response to a growing refuse problem on the streets. They respond anytime there is a need without hesitation.



The City Sewer Plant operates along the Roubidoux Creek, behind the Roubidoux Park. Our plant operators and water department work tirelessly to provide clean water and that our waste water is clean and environmentally safe to be released back into the Roubidoux Creek. The plant cleans 408 million gallons of waste water per year, with the quality of cleaned water matching and/or exceeding the water in the Creek. We will be highlighting the

\*adopted conflict of interest procedures for city staff and council


\*updated street overlays, the animal shelter annex and the construction of the Little Heroes Playground
