WAYNESVILLE'S 2018 GOALS AND PLANS

With the adoption of a \$17.2 million budget for this fiscal year, the City has another busy year planned for improving infrastructure and making needed additions to the City.

G. W. Lane Street, which fronts the High School, is scheduled to have a third lane added and sidewalks on the north side. New equipment for street department and police department is planned. A handicapped accessible bathroom in the Roubidoux Park will be a welcome addition on the east side of the Little Heroes Playground. Using MoDOT and FAA grants, we will be building a new parallel taxi-way at the Waynesville/St. Robert Regional Airport. This will improve our service at Forney Field and continue our plans to promote commercial aviation there.



Investing in our utility system and infrastructure will make them more efficient and safe for citizens. This year we will celebrate the 175th anniversary of the designation of the County Seat for Pulaski County. Our original Route 66 bridge will turn 95 this year.

We also plan to light Croaker atop the Waynesville Hill, using solar lights. Plans continue for an automated crosswalk downtown.



The City plans to complete installing automatic readers for our utilities and to continue installing LED lights on our streetlights. We are adding re-closures to our electric system each year. These allow the electric system to reset itself after an outage, saving time and manpower. It will be another busy year for the City of Waynesville!

*announced the closing on a purchase of land off G. W. Lane Street


