CITY COUNCIL NOTES

- *thanked Councilman Tim Mann for his service to the City
- *swore in a new council member for Ward Two, Donald Ungerecht, and incumbent council members, Dr. Jerry Brown, Michael Curtis and Ed Conley
- *passed an ordinance restricting smoking and drinking during Youth Sporting events and on City Park property
- *passed an ordinance acquiring land for a water tower in Northern Heights, as part of the purchase of that water system
- *accepted a contract for a steel water tower for Sunset Drive

COUNCIL NOTES, Cont.

- *reported \$3.3 million in reserve accounts
- *received an annual report from the Sustainable Ozarks Partnership
- *authorized the Waynesville Police Department to join the South Central Drug Task Force
- *electric easement work will begin in the Hull Valley Drive area
- *the WSR Youth Sports program has 30 soccer teams with 347 children signed up to participate
- *announced WSR Youth Sports Day with the Springfield Cardinals on June 23rd, tickets are on sale on the City Hall
- *adopted the 2018-22 Capital Improvement Plan

ELECTION RESULTS

*The Municipal Election was held on April 3rd. Three Wards had uncontested races for Council. Ward Two had no one signed up for the position, as Tim Mann did not file for re-election. Replacing him will be write-in candidate, Donald Ungerecht. *The School Board has a new face with the election of Janet Crider and incumbent, Paul Shultz. *Proposition 1, the effort to collect Out of State Use Tax, passed in Waynesville with a vote of 2 to 1 in favor. This will allow us to collect taxes from on line purchases. *Thank you to the citizens and to our friends willing to step up and serve.
