## CITY PLANS FOR 2019 AND 2018 PROJECT UPDATE



As the new year arrives, the City of Waynesville looks to the new fiscal year and completes several projects left unfinished from 2018.

The Sunset Water Tower is now up and should be on line early in the year.



The Waynesville St. Robert Regional Airport is poised for big improvements in the new year and look forward to welcoming a jet service to the airport. Contour Airlines is expected to be named the Essential Air Service provider and will offer a 30 seat passenger jet for service to St. Louis. The new year will see improvements to the parallel taxiway area and plans will begin for a new terminal to accommodate a larger passenger list.

The City annexed 197 acres on and around Bollinger Hill, near Pippin Road. The City purchased two water systems in surrounding county areas. The Waynesville/St. Robert Youth Sports program continues to grow.

The City partnered with St. Robert and the Sewer District on a 50-year contract with FLW to run their Water/Waste Water Treatment Plants. The transition will be complete in the summer of 2019. In 2019, expect an extension of the Roubidoux Walking Trail, as the City was awarded an \$88,000 grant to make improvements and additions to the trail.

The City's Animal Shelter continues to adopt dogs. The FLW Animal Shelter has been closed for re-hab and will reopen in the summer of 2019.

The City has been embroiled in a fight to stop an unprecedented increase in natural gas transportation rates. This process will continue into the new year. Details will follow when decisions are made. Be expecting more recycling bins, as the Cities received a grant for them.

Kum & Go and Taco Bell opened in 2018 in West Waynesville. Welcome!

The City has been working on several mitigation projects on the Mitchell Creek area, addressing issues brought to light after the 2013 flood. A detention area has been created above Tiger Bridge and we continue to remove excess gravel and recycle it for city projects. We continue to clear electric

lines and improve our feeder lines in the City. We are paving streets and with the new Internet Use tax, expect to do more.


Big Bam came to town and brought over 400 bikers.
