

**CITY COUNCIL NOTES**


- \*honored Business Graphics as the Business Spotlight of the Month

- \*passed ordinances defining Conflicts of Interest for City Staff and Elected Officials
- \*passed resolutions for grant applications involving engineering and equipment
- \*passed an ordinance to fund the Master Plan and Airport Layout for the Regional Airport
- \*set the 2019 ad valorem tax rate for the City at \$0.6346 per \$100 of assessed valuation, an increase of \$0.0016, after a public hearing
- \*reported \$3.28 million in bank and reserve accounts. Sales tax is 3% higher than budget projections.
