## 2020 BUDGET IS PLANNED

Local government must present and maintain a balanced budget for its activities and setting priorities is a large part of determining the budget for the coming year. The City sets goals and has adopted a Capital Improvement Plan for guidance. Each department head brings his/her list of projects planned for the coming year, as well as usual operating costs.

After several meetings, the budget is put together by our Finance Officer and then, reviewed again, before presenting it to the Finance Committee and finally, the City Council for approval in November.

This year's budget is another \$20 million list of projects and goals that the city staff and Council has determined. Some of the bigger items budgeted for include more road repair and maintenance, a new police car, sidewalks, completion of the Walking Trail extension into downtown Waynesville, another accessible bathroom for the park area, airport grant projects and play equipment for Tiger Park.

- \*adopted a new contract with Richland concerning natural gas rates


**OCTOBER GOOD CITIZEN**
