E-BILLING JOINS OTHER OPTIONS FOR UTILITIES

City of Waynesville Utility Customers now have the option to "Go Green" with our new e-billing system and receive their utility bill and newsletter by email rather than by regular mail. With e-billing, your utility bill is received sooner and the paperless option saves trees and helps protect our environment. It also saves money for the city, which could go to other projects.

If you are interested, you can sign up online at our website www.waynesvillemo.org or you can come by our office at City Hall.

In the last few years, the City has added an interactive website where you can view your utility usage and payments for the past year and you can see your upcoming bill as it is posted. You can make credit card payments, also. We offer ACH, Automatic Checking through your financial institution, as an way to avoid check writing and coming to city hall. At certain times of the year, we also offer the option of level pay for the year. Our utility department works hard to offer convenience to our customers and reliable service.



MUNICIPAL FILINGS

Filing for city offices closed on January 21st. The Waynesville mayor is the only one of the county's five mayors up for re-election on the April 7th ballot. Waynesville Ward I Councilman Dr. Jerry Brown has filed for the seat, and his three incumbent colleagues on the council, Ward II Councilman Cecil Davis, Ward III Councilman Ed Conley and Ward IV Councilman Michael Curtis, have filed for re-election to their seats. Brown's current Ward I seat is being sought by Robert Rice and Shaun Stewart. The Waynesville mayor serves a four-year term. City council seats are two-year terms unless people were appointed to fill unexpired terms.
