As a city, we continue to monitor the Coronavirus situation and gather as much information as possible. We are well aware of the President's and Governor's announcements and are following those guidelines. We weekly check with the Pulaski County Health Department concerning any new announcements. The Council did pass an Emergency Declaration for the City to allow for emergency responses. Decisions being made concerning the Schools and Fort Leonard Wood are out of our hands, but we maintain an open communication with both.

Our employees have been following established protocols concerning illness. Be sure to check on your elderly neighbors. Many of them are fearful of getting out and shopping. This might be a good thing for you to do for them. As part of the "elderly" population, I am avoiding large crowds and maintain distances. I am a hugger and that has stopped. I am religiously washing my hands, much more than normal and trying to follow all the advice being given by the CDC. We will make it through this. Congratulations and thanks for all you do for our city and community.



CITY COUNCIL NOTES

- *honored Twyla Cordry as March Citizen of the Year
- *recognized Lone Oak Printing as our Business Spotlight
- *reported \$3.79 million in bank accounts, with \$2.78 million in reserved and restricted accounts
- *updated the relocation of electric lines in the park to underground line
- *reported materials are being ordered for the extension of the Walking Trail in Roubidoux Park
- *announced the postponement of the Youth Sports program due to virus concerns
- *announced the extension of sewer line in the Industrial Park

- *passed several ordinances:
 - approved an agreement with the City of Richland concerning natural gas
 - established safety procedures for propane tanks in the city limits
 - authorized the sale of Certificates of Participation to fund several major projects
 - updated ordinances concerning vehicle turn signals and prohibited traveling in the turn lane
 - passed a supplemental agreement between the Cities and the Sec of the Army concerning the Regional Airport
