## UPDATE ON CORONA VIRUS PRECAUTIONS

The City supports the Stay at Home order issued by Governor Mike Parson. Governor Parson issued a statewide "Stay Home Missouri" Order in early April to go through early May.

In order to protect public health and prevent the further spread of COVID-19, Governor Parson's Order includes specific guidance for staying home, social distancing, businesses and employees, schools, restaurants, state government buildings.

**MISSOURI STAY-AT-HOME ORDER**

Missourians can only leave home for essential travel, essential activities or to work for essential business.

**Essential Workers/Businesses:**  
Healthcare, law enforcement, first responders, pharmacies, grocery stores, gas stations, government services, banks, delivery services

**Allowed Activities:**  
- Going to grocery/convenience stores  
- Going to pharmacies, medical appointments  
- Going to a restaurant for curbside or drive-thru  
- Taking a walk, riding a bike, outdoor exercise

## UTILITIES ANNOUNCEMENT RELATING TO VIRUS CONCERNS

City staff understands that many of you may be experiencing difficulties during the current COVID-19 outbreak. Because of this, the City of Waynesville's Utility Billing Department has implemented the following policies and procedures in order to make life a little easier during this stressful time.

### Utility Disconnects

All disconnects due to non-payment have been suspended until May

15<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Those customers who enter into a Pay Agreement in regards to their past due bill will not accrue fees or penalties as long as they honor their agreement.

### Pay Agreements

The Utility Billing Department has modified its Pay Agreement policy to better fit the individual customer and their needs during this uncertain time. Please contact the Utility Billing Department by phone or email to explore different options that may help your situation.

### Online Payments

For those who may not be able to make it to City Hall during this time due to self-isolation and other reasons, the online service charge has been waived, for a period of time, if you need to pay your bill online. Due to processing requirements, the fee cannot be waived for payments made with a credit card over the phone or in person.

### Payment Assistance

If you are still having trouble with your bill the Missouri Ozarks Community Action, Inc. (MOCA) may be able to assist you further through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) and the Emergency Crisis Intervention Program ECIP. 
**CITY COUNCIL NOTES**
