

On June 2, 2020 Waynesville citizens were finally able to hit the polls and vote for a new Mayor and Councilman. Longtime Councilman from Ward I, Dr. Jerry Brown, who was uncontested as he celebrated his new position as Mayor that evening, watched a close race for his Council seat between Shawn Stewart and Rob Rice. In a 21 to 19 vote, Mr. Rice became the newly elected Ward I Councilman for the City of Waynesville along side incumbents Cecil Davis of Ward II, Ed Conley of Ward III and Mike Curtis of Ward IV. Dr. Brown and Mr. Rice were sworn into office during the June meeting.

Both Dr. Brown and Councilman Rice have close ties with the Community. Dr. Brown, an optometrist with a well-known office located on Hwy F, began his service with the City in 2011 as a member of the Planning and Zoning Commission. In 2012 he took one of two Ward I seats on the City Council and since that time, Dr. Brown has served on several Committees including the Economic Development and Police Committees.

Councilman Rice, a Waynesville native whose family name goes back generations, owns and operates Spur Name Tapes in downtown Waynesville. After success-

fully navigating his first official City Council Meeting, Councilman Rice stated he is looking forward to working with the Council and staff on future projects. Councilman Rice was appointed to the Economic Development and Police Committees.

Storm Damage

Almost coming out of nowhere, a violent storm wrecked havoc in the City late in the afternoon on July 7th. City Crews were out all evening and most of the night working diligently to restore power to the citizens of West Waynesville. The strong winds ripped branches from trees, meter bases

from homes and left debris scattered across Ward II. Thankfully, by early the next morning, all those without power during the nighttime hours breathed a sigh of relief as lights flickered and power was restored.

City Hall also felt the sting of the storm's destruction as

the power surge and subsequent outage knocked the City's online bill-payment systems offline. The Utility Department would like to thank everyone for their patience this month. They appreciate everyone's understanding and willingness to work with them.

Roubidoux Park Restroom

The new restroom in the Roubidoux Park is nearing completion and will help better serve the patrons of our park especially during youth sports events and other Special Events such as Old Settler's Day and the Cave State Cruisers.

City Leaf & Limb Facility

The City Leaf and Limb Facility is for citizens who live within the City Limits of Waynesville. Contractors may access the facility by purchasing a City permit at City Hall.

VW Grant Funding

Thanks to the hard work and effort of Executive Assistant Miriam Jones, the City has been awarded grant funding in the amount of \$61,520.00 from the Department of Natural Resources to use for the procurement of a new City Dump Truck. This funding was provided to the State as part of a settlement concerning Volkswagen's emissions report.
