## CITY OVERHAULS LICENSE CODE

At October's City Council meeting, an Ordinance amending the City's Business License Code was introduced and passed. Needing an update, the Code was amended to better reflect current business standards. Some of the changes included regulating Mobile Food Vendors, updating Taxicab regulations along with the City's Liquor License laws.

Mobile Food Vendors, a form of food service not regulated in the City before, received special attention. "We are excited to see Mobile Food Vendors making their way into Waynesville. The ordinance passed last night provides regulations that are better

sued to this type of vendor.", said City Clerk Michele Brown.

The City has also designated certain areas in the City's Parks that are available to Mobile Food Vendors to rent. If you are a Mobile Food Vendor and would like to rent space in the Roundabout Park, please contact City Hall at (573) 774-6171.

Taxicabs and other Vehicles for Hire received their own update. One of the biggest changes is that Taxi Cab Drivers can now receive their permit directly from the City Clerk's Office instead of waiting the thirty days or so for the next City Council Meeting. Also, TNC Businesses (Transportation Network Companies) such as Uber and Lyft are now governed by City Code. Lastly, the City's Liquor License law, not updated since 2009, saw an increase to permit fees, as well.
